## Pocket paint kit

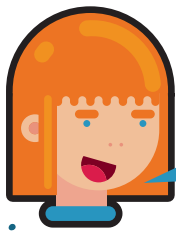

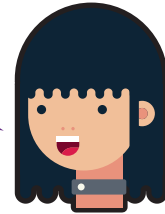

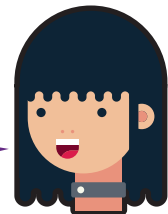

Most Australians will have seen a galah. It is a colourful bird that is found all over Australia. The galah has a pink front, a grey back and a white crest.

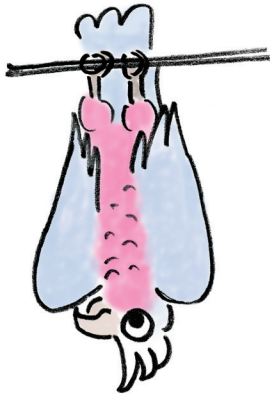
Galahs are usually found in groups. They can be seen sitting in trees, looking for seeds on the ground, or playing on powerlines.

Galahs are intelligent birds that seem to like having fun. Here are some of their antics.

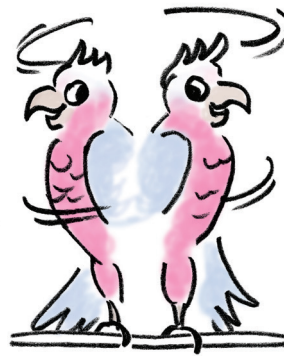
## Hanging around
